

Child Safeguarding Policy

INTRODUCTION

This document lays out the minimal general standards of child safeguarding that the Workshop for Civic Initiatives Foundation /WCIF/ implements in its work, together with the respective procedures and mechanisms.

The policy is approved and signed by the Board of Trustees and is consistent with the rights of the child set out in the UN Convention, European and Bulgarian legislation. It applies to all members of the board, to all employees and volunteers of the Foundation. The policy also applies to WCIF partners and beneficiaries of the funds and programs of the Foundation, by signing a special declaration (Annex4), whereas they are further encouraged to develop their own policies and procedures for child safeguarding.

The main objective of the child safeguarding policy is to protect children from any sort of maltreatment or abuse. Children and young people need support and security, protection from the effects of poverty, abuse, isolation and violence. Individual children might be at risk of specific forms of maltreatment on behalf of adults and other children, in case of natural disasters and unforeseen incidents.

This policy is disseminated among the employees of the Foundation and is reviewed every 3 years, or whenever necessary.

DEFINITIONS IN THE WCIF CHILD SAFEGURDING POLICY

Abuse and neglect:

/1/ "Any recent act or failure to act on the part of a parent or caregiver which results in death, serious physical or emotional harm, sexual abuse or exploitation; or an act or failure to act which presents an imminent risk of serious harm to the child."

/2/ "...intentional behavior against children, which is likely to inflict physical or psychological harm"

/3/ "An abused child is a child, whose parents or caregivers cause a serious physical harm (or allow any harm); create or allow significant risk for serious abuse; allow the child to be sexually abused or abuse it themselves."

Main forms of maltreatment, in the evaluation of which key terms are intentionality of action, seriousness of the injury, lack of action:

- physical abuse – any intentional harm inflicted on the child by a parent or caregiver;
- sexual abuse – using a child or youth for sexual gratification;
- neglect – chronic inability of a parent or caregiver to accommodate the basic needs of the child;
- psychological abuse – includes neglect, inability of a parent or caregiver to provide the necessary support, attention and affection to the child; psychological abuse such as chronic patterns of behavior such as humiliation, insults, ridicule of the child."

General definitions:

Physical injury: Can include hitting, shaking, throwing, poisoning, burning, drowning, strangling, or any other physical injury to a child, including tampering with symptoms or deliberately worsening the health of the child.

Neglect: persistent failure to meet basic physical/psychological needs of the child, which may result in serious damage to children's health or development, such as not providing it with enough food, sufficient shelter and clothing, as well as neglect and irresponsibility to the core emotional needs of the child.

Emotional neglect: neglect of the emotions: negative attitude to the emotions of the child or emotional torture of the child, influencing its development. Also includes showing children they are worthless, unloved and good-for-nothing, that they exist only because of the need of another person; or when they are placed under the wrong expectations. In addition, it includes children being often frightened on purpose, exploited or debauched.

Sexual abuse: it involves forcing or luring a child into sexual activity, regardless whether the child is aware or not aware of what is happening. These actions can include physical contact, including penetration or other inappropriate actions. They can also include involvement of children in viewing or producing pornography, or encouraging them to display inappropriate behavior.

Under additional provision to the regulations for implementation of the Child Protection Act in Bulgarian legislation /paragraph 1/:

"Violence" over a child is any act of physical, mental and sexual abuse, neglect, commercial or other exploitation, resulting in actual or potential harm to the health, life, development or dignity of the child, which may take place in the family, school and social environment.

"Physical violence" is causing bodily harm, including the infliction of pain or suffering without ensuing health disorder.

"Psychological violence" are all actions that may have adverse effects on mental health and child development, such as underestimation, mocking attitude, threats, discrimination, rejection or other forms of negative attitudes, as well as the inability of the parent, guardian or the person caring for the child, to provide appropriate and supportive environment.

"Sexual violence" is the use of a child for sexual gratification.

"Neglect" is the failure of the parent, guardian or the caretaker for the child to ensure the child's development in the following areas: health, education, emotional development, nutrition, provision of home and safety, whenever they are able to provide for it.

STANDARDS FOR CHILD SAFEGUARDING

The main principles that correspond with the standards are directly related to children's rights and are in accordance with the Bulgarian and international legislation. They reflect the minimal requirements and mechanisms that should be covered in the Workshop for Civic Initiatives Foundation to ensure the effective protection of children from abuse.

Standard 1

Developed written policy document to ensure child safeguarding:

- 1.1. Written succinctly and reflecting the understanding of the Foundation of abuse and violence against children;
- 1.2. Approved by the Board of Trustees;
- 1.3. It affects all activities of the organization.

Standard 2

Implementation of the child safeguarding policy:

- 2.1. There are clear rules describing the steps that should be taken whenever there are concerns about the safeguarding of a child.
- 2.2. All employees are familiar with the rules for child safeguarding and the rules are available to all - children, parents, consultants, volunteers.
- 2.3. There is a particular a person in the foundation who is directly responsible for implementing the

rules for child safeguarding.

2.4. There is a procedure for processing incidents, complaint-handling and signaling of the relevant authorities.

2.5. There are guidelines for respecting confidentiality of the shared information.

Standard 3

Preventing violence against children:

3.1. A special methodology and evaluation of the suitability to work with children is applied when selecting staff, volunteers and consultants.

3.2. Each new employee provides relevant documents required by law and / or duly requested by the employer, including references.

3.3. An employee who does not implement the standards, rules and procedures for child protection, adopted by the organization and does not comply with the WCIF Rules and Code of Ethics is subject to disciplinary action under labor legislation.

3.4. Through its projects and programs, WCIF encourages the adoption of monitoring and protection mechanisms as well as requirements for compliance with the Child Safeguarding Policy. The child protection is an important component in risk assessment in all WCIF programs and projects. Risk assessment is carried out of all programs, projects and activities. Risk mitigation strategies will be elaborated and these will be incorporated in the design, implementation and evaluation of the programs, projects and activities where children are involved or are affected.

3.5. Any training provided by the Foundation relevant to working with children and young people includes the subject of child safeguarding from abuse and violence.

Standard 4

Training to ensure the child safeguarding:

4.1. All employees, volunteers, consultants and other partners of WCIF undergo instruction and/or training for child safeguarding during induction, which allows them to understand the need for child protection and are acquainted with the warning system. .

4.2. Those responsible for recruiting new staff receive guidance on methods for safe recruitment.

4.3. The person responsible for implementing the Child Safeguarding Policy in the organization is trained annually by a specialist/consultant.

4.4. Children receive advice and support on how to protect themselves via specially prepared training materials composed in an accessible and understandable language.

Standard 5

Ensuring equal rights of child protection regardless of their gender, age, ethnicity and religion:

5.1. The training and procedures on child safeguarding help employees identify the risks some children are exposed to due to their ethnicity and/or race, age, gender, religion, culture, disability.

5.2. In the Foundation's Code of Ethics it is clearly stated that everyone is responsible for mutual respect, tolerance and nondiscrimination.

Standard 6

Implementation and Monitoring:

- 6.1. There are written documents that enlist the procedures and mechanisms in implementing the Child Safeguarding Policy.
- 6.2. All signals and cases of violence against children are documented and undergo monitoring and control.
- 6.3. There are mechanisms for feedback on complying with the child safeguarding policy via the reporting documents for each program.
- 6.4. Policies and procedures for child protection are reviewed every three years and, if necessary, updated.

Standard 7

Working with partners and beneficiaries in the implementation of standards

- 7.1. There is an established communication with partners and beneficiaries on the issues of child safeguarding, through which to exchange information and experience, and develop quality coherent approaches towards child safeguarding.
- 7.2. Partners and beneficiaries are familiar with the existing policy for child safeguarding and the accompanying procedures.
- 7.3. Policies and mechanisms for child safeguarding are an element of the agreements between partners and beneficiaries.

PROCEDURES AND MECHANISMS FOR IMPLEMENTATION

1. The WCIF Executive Director is responsible for the implementation of this policy.
2. In case of concern and/or identified child abuse, communication goes through the person directly responsible for the child safeguarding policy in the foundation, appointed by the Executive Director /Annex 1/.
3. Any information related to abuse must be documented according to a form /Annex 2/ so that all cases are registered. This information is confidential and kept secret. Confidentiality is broken only if it is in the best interest of the child. When there are confirmed cases of child abuse, child protection services/police department should be alerted.
4. The clarification of policies and procedures is part of the induction process for new employees and board members, volunteers or associates. All employees are obliged to sign a Declaration /Annex 3/ stating that they have familiarised themselves with it and accept the policy. Employees who breach the policies are responsible under the provisions of the labor regulations.
5. WCIF motivates and encourages all beneficiaries and partners in the Foundation's programs and projects to implement child safeguarding policies and comply with the requirements and standards of the European and Bulgarian legislation for child rights protection /Annex 4/.

6. The organization of activities involving children, including transportation of children, are in accordance with the requirements of Bulgarian legislation.

7. The policy is monitored and evaluated to ensure security and its proper implementation. This involves supporting training, discussion of cases and receiving feedback from partners and beneficiaries, as well as formal report once a year from the person responsible for its implementation, determined by the Executive Director of WCIF.

8. Once a year a training is organized for all employees on basic concepts of child safeguarding, as well as on the procedures for their implementation in the organization.

PROCEDURE FOR ACCEPTANCE OF SIGNALS FOR CHILDREN AT RISK

Upon receipt of a signal / in person, by letter, email or phone call/:

1/ If it concerns a child at risk, the reporting person should be consulted on how to prepare and report the signal to the Department for Child Protection /CPD/ according to residence of the child /or the police in case the child is homeless/.

- it is advised to file the signal with a copy to WCIF to ensure a greater likelihood to receive a response and as well as WCIF to be able to assist in the process.

2/ if a citizen requires consultation/communication via the Community Support Centre, it is directed to a consultant of the CSC;

- CSC has the contact details of all the CPDs and police stations in the country and is able to inform and guide citizens towards them.

CODE OF CONDUCT TOWARDS CHILDREN

The code of conduct etiquette is a cumulative of regulations addressing the appropriate and correct behavior as regards to ensuring child protection. They further address the protection of adults of false allegations in inappropriate behavior or abuse/violence. This etiquette applies to employees, volunteers, members of the Board, grantees and sponsors, as well as to all visitors/guests under the organisations projects.

- The WCIF employees should not stay the night alone with one or more children or minors, neither in employees accommodation nor in project-related premises, nor in any other sites
- The WCIF employees should not hire underaged as housekeepers, nor shelter any minors in their homes. Minor is defined as every child under the age of 18.
- The WCIF employees should not caress, hold, kiss, hug or touch any minors in a way that is inappropriate or unacceptable based on the cultural setting. In order to avoid any misunderstanding, it is advised to ask the for permission before you hold their hand.
- Whenever possible and feasible, the rule of the “two adults presence” should be abided, where two or more adults observe all activities, in which minors and children are involved. Furthermore, they are present constantly at site. If that is not possible, the WCIF staff has the right to look for alternative decisions, such as community members during child visits. The WCIF employees have to take into account that they might be confronted with cases where children might attempt to receive “special attention” due to specific circumstances

and abuse they have experienced. The adult is always the one responsible, even when the child exhibits seductive behavior. The adults have to avoid situations where they can be placed in embarrassing or vulnerable position.

- Inappropriate behavior towards children entails disciplinary measures.
- The WCIF employees have to take into consideration the way they are perceived through their language, activities, and relations with children.

USAGE OF IMAGES AND VIDEOMATERIALS

When using visual materials, the WCIF guiding principle is to respect the dignity in depicting children, families and communities. The policy about visual images of the foundation is part of the Child Safeguarding Policy.

1. Images of children are used only when authorized (signed declaration) of parent/legal guardian **/Annex 5/**.
2. Permission is requested for taking pictures or video material for each individual case and it is clearly described in the declaration of consent for what purposes the images will be used. Consent to take and use pictures is requested from the parents and those with parental responsibility, or directly from children/young people when they are of appropriate age. (Applies to children aged 14 according to Article 11, paragraph 3 of the CPA).
3. Images from photo banks are used with reference to the source of the photo or video material.
4. Style and propriety standards, matching the WCIF values and of the people who support the organization are upheld.
5. Workshop for Civic Initiatives Foundation cannot be held responsible if the photos on the website, social network profiles or photos in press releases are used by media and third parties in a way that does not correspond to the facts.
6. When taking pictures of or filming children that the Foundation works with (and has a permission from their parents/guardians) the media/photographers sign a declaration agreeing to use the video/image truthfully and only for the specific case **/Annex 6/**.
7. When taking pictures of or filming children from orphanages or other types of social services, the regulations of the CPA are observed. /with a mandatory written statement by the protection authority implementing the measure. "(Art. 11, paragraph 2).

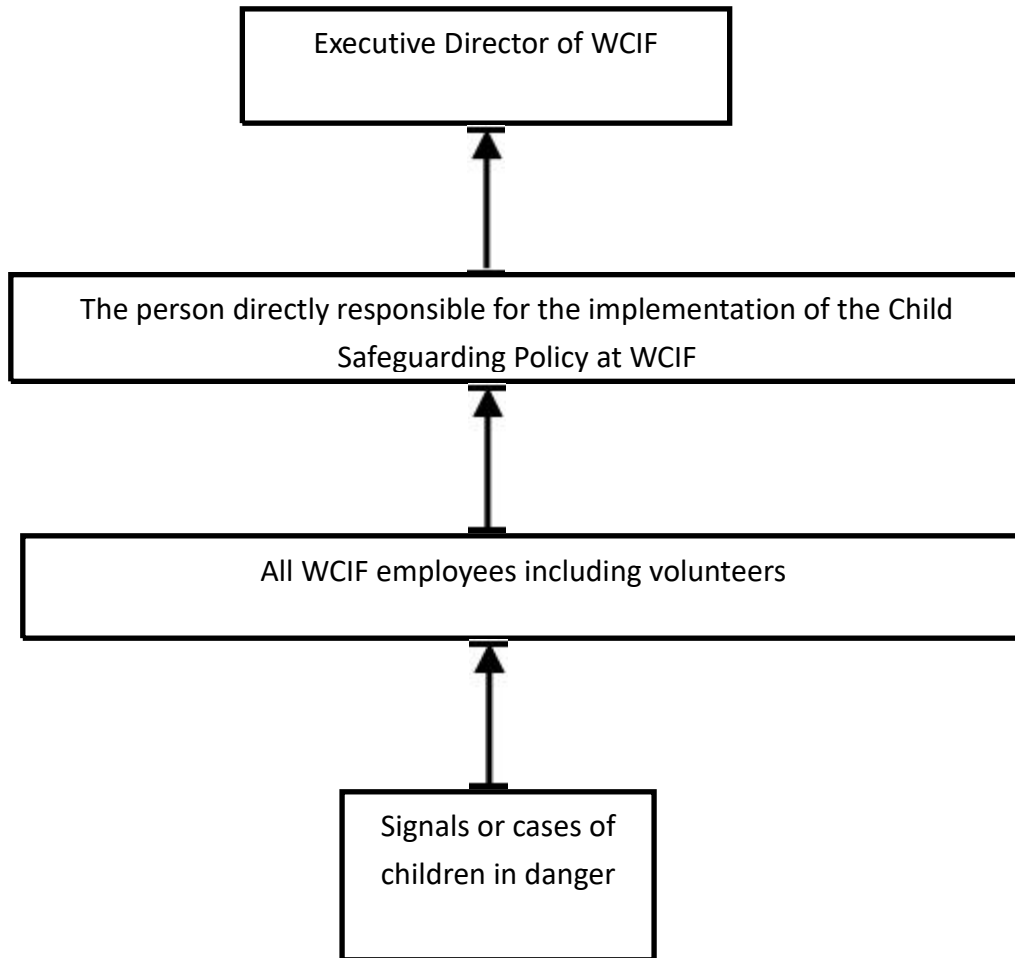
The Child Safeguarding Policy is adopted by the Board of Trustees of WCIF.
